Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

A male blue Boston Terrier was observed limping on its left hind leg. The dog was being housed with another tan colored Boston terrier. The dog was not bearing any weight on the leg, and was observed holding it up in the air. The licensee had not previously identified this issue. Animals with any health issues need to be identified and communicated to the attending veterinarian in a timely manner. The license initiated corrective actions by contacting the attending veterinarian to arrange veterinary care for this animal.

Time and method of identification.

The facility has no official identification for the dogs on hand, both adults and weaned puppies. All dogs must be identified at the facility. The licensee must develop and maintain a system of identification and maintain records containing the required information. Failure to properly identify all dogs in the facility also does not allow for animal tracking, which is especially important in the event of a disease outbreak.

Records: Dealers and exhibitors.

An inventory of all dogs at the facility must be maintained and all required information must be documented and available for review. Facility must develop and maintain a record keeping system in order to properly document all required information.

3.1(a)

Housing facilities, general.

1. A wooden stockade fence had fallen down partially and was observed leaning on the outdoor chain-link fencing of the outdoor dog enclosures. This condition could compromise the enclosures and potentially cause injury to the dogs. All structures must be kept in good repair and be structurally sound.

2. Two enclosures were observed with jagged edges around the dog doors leading to the outdoor portion of the enclosure. Jagged edges cannot be effectively sanitized, may contribute to injury of the animals. Facilities must be kept in good repair.

3.11(a)

Cleaning, sanitization, housekeeping, and pest control.

There was an excessive buildup of feces observed in some of the outdoor enclosures. This condition can harbor disease causing agents and can cause health issues. Cleaning primary enclosures needs to occur daily to prevent buildup of waste.
