Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

A brown and white weanling guinea pig was observed to have hair loss with numerous scabs on the bridge of its nose approximately 3/4 of an inch in diameter. This guinea pig was housed with 17 other weanlings. There were no observation or treatment records present prior to this inspection noting this condition. The written program of veterinary care on file says that guinea pigs with ringworm should be separated and treated with a fungal cream. At time of inspection owner's wife treated this guinea pig with a fungal cream and recorded the treatment in a vet log book.

Failure to observe animals daily can result in guinea pigs not receiving appropriate treatment which could lead to worsening and spreading of the condition. Licensee must observe animals daily, treat animals according to the program of veterinary care on file, and communicate with the attending veterinarian when there are problems with animal health .
Correct by September 21, 2022.

Primary enclosures.

Space. Insufficient space was being provided to two enclosures housing weanling guinea pigs. The 2nd wire enclosure housing 19 weanlings and the 4th wire enclosure housing 12 weanlings measures 31 by 19 or 589 square inches of floor space. Weanling guinea pigs weighing up to 350 grams require at least 60 square inches of floor space each. Can not

house more than 9 weanlings in this size enclosure.

Inadequate space can cause stress and aggression in animals. Licensee must ensure that guinea pigs are provided with at least the minimum amount of floor space per animal to prevent unnecessary stress and discomfort to the animals. Correct by September 22, 2022.
