Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

A dog was identified at the facility needing veterinary care. The facility did not identify the issue prior to the inspection. An adult female Bernese Mountain Dog (#74819) was found to have a wound on the inside tip of the right ear. The bleeding wound measured approximately 0.5 inches with a dark crust and hair loss around the edges. Failure to conduct adequate daily observations to assess the health and well-being of the animals with direct and frequent communication to the attending veterinarian can delay treatment leading to the condition getting worse and delays in healing. Each dealer shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include daily observation of all animals to assess their health and well-being and that a mechanism of direct and frequent communication is required so that timely and accurate information on problems of animal health, behavior, and well-being is conveyed to the attending veterinarian. Correct by ensuring that the animal is examined and treated by a licensed veterinarian.

3.1(c)(3)

Housing facilities, general.

Enclosures are not being cleaned properly. The door leading from the inside to the outside runs of most of the enclosures is soiled with a black/brown material. Inadequate and infrequent cleaning and sanitization allows for the growth of disease-causing agents that may increase the risk of health hazards for the animals. Appropriate cleaning and sanitization of the surfaces must include removal of the buildup of material found and to prevent accumulation of this material. All surfaces of housing facilities must be cleaned and sanitized when necessary to satisfy generally accepted husbandry standards and practices. Correct by ensuring hard surfaces with which the dogs come into contact with are spot cleaned daily and sanitized in accordance with 3.11 (b) of this subpart to prevent accumulation of excreta and reduce disease hazards.

3.3(e)(1)(iii)

Sheltered housing facilities.

Enclosures contain surfaces that are not impervious to moisture. In most of the outside runs, the wood trim above the doors leading to the inside contains small chew marks revealing wood that are not impervious to moisture. Surfaces in contact with the animals that are not impervious to moisture can absorb moisture and harbor bacteria while being unable to be properly cleaned and sanitized possibly exposing the animals to disease hazards. Correct by ensuring all walls,

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boxes, houses, dens, and other surfaces in contact with the animals in sheltered housing facilities are impervious to moisture.
