FACILITIES, GENERAL.

At least four holes are present on the roof and soffit that are large enough to let vermin and wild animals enter the animal housing area. This area houses three raccoons and five foxes. Vermin and wild animals could potentially spread disease or injury the animals.

Repair the holes to prevent entrance of vermin and wild animals.

To be corrected: 9-24-17

The adult 2y old female's raccoon enclosure has some woven wire attached to the sides that has some sharp points the raccoon can contact. Sharp wire points and loose wire can cause injury to animals.

Ensure that the loose wire is secured and that there are no sharp, jagged, or rough edges that animals can contact in their enclosures.
