Housing facilities, general.

The floor in the indoor portion of the small dogs' kennel and the indoor and outdoor portions of the large dogs' kennel are no longer impervious to moisture.

Primary enclosures.

The indoor portion of the primary enclosure housing a male miniature Australian shepherd (microchip number ending 857860) and the indoor portion of the primary enclosure housing a female golden retriever (microchip number ending 347902) each had a 3" by 5" area of the wall next to the dog door was chewed.

Primary enclosures must be designed and constructed of suitable materials so that they are structurally sound. The primary enclosures must be kept in good repair.

The licensee must ensure the primary enclosures are kept in good repair to prevent ingestion or veterinary medical issues.

3.13(a)

Veterinary care for dogs.

The program of veterinary care does not have the frequency of testing and preventative treatment for heartworm or the frequency of preventative care and treatment for care of haircoats, nails, eyes, ears, skin, and teeth.

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Each dealer must follow an appropriate program of veterinary care for dogs that is developed, documented in writing, and signed by the attending veterinarian.

The written program of veterinary care must address the requirements for adequate veterinary care for every dealer in § 2.40 of this subchapter.

The licensee must ensure the program of veterinary care includes the frequency of testing and preventative treatment of heartworm and the frequency of preventative care of haircoats, nails, eyes, ears, skin, and teeth to allow for adequate and appropriate veterinary care to the animals.
