Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

Several medications are expired or do not have an expiration date on the container.

- Isopropyl Alcohol expired 12/2025
- Pyrantel expired March 2025
- Fenbendazole in a jar with no expiration date
- Toltrazuril in a container with no expiration date
- Ivermectin expired March 2025

Expired medications do not ensure that the medications are effective at treating disease or illness and the health of the animal may suffer. Each dealer shall use appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries. The facility must ensure all medications are not expired.

Time and method of identification.

Three litters of puppies do not have an individual identification number assigned to them on cage cards. The licensee states he will sometimes wait until the puppies are weaned to assign them a number. The following litters did not have identification: 6 puppies born February 28, 2026; 7 puppies born March 7, 2026; 8 puppies born March 20, 2026. Proper dog identification is required and can be important in animal health tracking. Ensure that each puppy under 16 weeks of age is properly identified in a timely manner.

Primary enclosures.

There are whelping boxes and doorways that have been heavily chewed in 8 enclosures housing a total of 13 adults and 34 puppies. Heavily chewed surfaces are not able to be readily cleaned and sanitized and may cause disease hazards to the animals. The licensee must ensure that all surfaces in contact with the dogs and cats to be readily cleaned and sanitized in accordance with § 3.11(b) of this subpart, or be replaceable when worn or soiled.

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Compatible grouping.

The licensee identified a female dog in labor with one puppy born housed with 3 other adult dogs. This female was due yesterday but the licensee said he did not think she was pregnant so he left her in the enclosure. Housing puppies with adult dogs that are not their dam or foster dam may result in injuries due to compatibility problems.

Puppies under 4 months of age or less may not be housed in the same primary enclosure with adult dogs other than their dams or foster dams. The licensee must ensure the puppies listed above are only housed with their dam, foster dam or other puppies under 4 months of age at all times.

This was fixed at the time of inspection.

3.11(b)(2)

Cleaning, sanitization, housekeeping, and pest control.

The licensee does not sanitize the sheltered primary enclosures, feeders or waterers for all dogs every 2 weeks. The licensee states sanitizing is done approximately two times per year with soap. Failure to sanitize enclosures may increase the risk of disease hazards towards the dogs.

Used primary enclosures and food and water receptacles for dogs must be sanitized at least once every 2 weeks and more often if necessary to prevent an accumulation of dirt, debris, food waste, excreta, and other disease hazards. Hard surfaces must be sanitized using one of the following methods: live steam under pressure or washing with hot water (at least 180° F) and soap or detergent. The licensee must clean and sanitize the primary enclosures and ensure that all aspects of the enclosure are maintained in a clean and sanitized condition in order to support the health of the dogs.

3.13(a)(3)

Veterinary care for dogs.

The facility is not always following the deworming plan for puppies.

-5 puppies born 30-December-2025- Safeguard not done day 54-56, Ivermectin day 56 not done

-7 puppies born 13-February-2026- Toltrazuril not done on day 24

-3 puppies born 5-February-2026- Toltrazuril not done day 4 and 14, pyrantel not done on day 5 and 12

Sampling of dogs for parasites is necessary to ensure the animals are receiving adequate veterinary care. Each dealer must follow an appropriate program of veterinary care for dogs that is developed, documented in writing, and signed by the attending veterinarian and includes sampling and treatment of parasites and other pests.
