Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

There is a bottle of fenbendazole plus metronidazole that expired June 12, 2026. Expired medications do not ensure that the medications are effective at treating disease or illness and the health of the animal may suffer. Each dealer shall use appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries. The facility must ensure all medications are not expired.

3.1(f)

Housing facilities, general.

There is no trash can in the facility and clutter and trash is accumulating on the floor of the kennel next to the food storage box. Lack of trash receptacles could create odors and attract pests such as flies and mice which could have a negative impact on the health of the dogs.

Trash containers in housing facilities must be leak-proof and have tightly fitted lids. The facility must add a trash can with a tightly fitted lid to ensure that potential odors are contained and to eliminate the possible attraction of pests.

3.6(a)(2)(ii)

Primary enclosures.

One enclosure housing 1 adult dog and her 7 puppies had a heated whelping box attached to a propane tank with a rubber hose attaching the two. Access to hazardous materials like propane tanks and hoses may cause a fire hazard and/or expose the dogs to toxic fumes. Primary enclosures must be constructed and maintained so that they protect the dogs from injury.

3.6(a)(2)(ix)

Primary enclosures.

There are whelping boxes and doorways that have been heavily chewed in at least 6 enclosures housing a total of 14 adults and 13 puppies. Heavily chewed surfaces are not able to be readily cleaned and sanitized and may cause disease hazards to the animals. The licensee must ensure that all surfaces in contact with the dogs and cats to be readily cleaned and sanitized in accordance with § 3.11(b) of this subpart, or be replaceable when worn or soiled.

3.11(b)(2)

Cleaning, sanitization, housekeeping, and pest control.

The licensee does not sanitize the sheltered primary enclosures, feeders or waterers for all dogs every 2 weeks or more often as to prevent a buildup of organic material. The facility representative states they sanitize the enclosures twice a week but not the feeders or waterers. At least 3 enclosures housing 11 adult dogs had an accumulation of dark to medium brown dry organic material buildup in the tray of the feeders. At least 5 enclosures housing 9 adults and 13 puppies had a buildup of organic brown material on the outdoor access doors. The dry food scoop used for all dog's kibble has a thick layer of dark brown organic material buildup covering approximately 50% of the surface area. Additionally there are wood blocks and cinder blocks present in the enclosures that are not able to be sanitized as they are not impervious to moisture. Failure to sanitize enclosures may increase the risk of disease hazards towards the dogs.

Used primary enclosures and food and water receptacles for dogs must be sanitized at least once every 2 weeks and more often if necessary to prevent an accumulation of dirt, debris, food waste, excreta, and other disease hazards. Hard surfaces must be sanitized using one of the following methods: live steam under pressure or washing with hot water (at least 180° F) and soap or detergent. The licensee must clean and sanitize the primary enclosures and ensure that all aspects of the enclosure are maintained in a clean and sanitized condition in order to support the health of the dogs.
