2.40(b)(2) REPEAT

ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

A tan, female pomeranian (Tag # 192) has small to large sized mats on its back legs and tail. The mats are superficial and are not tightly adhered to the skin. The hair-coat is starting to become rope-like and twisted. Matting can be painful and can lead to skin disease and other medical conditions. All dogs need to have their hair-coats routinely maintained in order to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases associated with excessive matting.

3.1(c)(2) REPEAT

HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Maintenance and replacement of surfaces.

In the west outdoor enclosures containing eight dogs, the plastic shelters have severely chewed and worn surfaces along the entrance. There is a small amount of dirt and hair stuck on the chewed surfaces. Chewed and worn surfaces cannot be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized, which can lead to disease hazards for the dogs. All chewed and worn surfaces must be repaired or replaced so they can be readily cleaned and sanitized.

3.4(b)(3)

OUTDOOR HOUSING FACILITIES.

There are at least eight plastic shelters being used in the outdoor housing area that have a damaged or missing wind and rain break. Lack of wind and rain breaks does not ensure the dogs are protected from the elements. The licensee must ensure all shelters being used be provided with a wind and rain break.

CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

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In the west outdoor enclosures containing eight dogs, there is overgrown vegetation in and along the pen on the west side. Overgrown vegetation can harbor pests and can lead to disease hazards for the animals. Premises where housing facilities are located must be kept clean and in good repair to protect the animals, from injury, to facilitate the husbandry practices required in this subpart and to reduce or eliminate breeding and living areas for rodents and other pests and vermin. Premises around the outdoor enclosures must be free of overgrown vegetation.
