



Inspection Report

Cleaning, sanitization, housekeeping, and pest control.

The facility has not been sanitizing as often as necessary to prevent an accumulation of organic debris in primary enclosures. In at least 2 primary enclosures housing 4 dogs, there is a light film of cobwebs, hair and dry organic material on the top of the wire enclosures. One enclosure housing 2 adult dogs had a wet film of hair and organic material on the front of the outdoor portion of the wire enclosure. Failure to sanitize enclosures often enough to prevent an accumulation of debris may increase the risk of disease hazards towards the dogs.

Used primary enclosures and food and water receptacles for dogs must be sanitized at least once every 2 weeks and more often if necessary to prevent an accumulation of dirt, debris, food waste, excreta, and other disease hazards. Hard surfaces must be sanitized using one of the following methods: live steam under pressure or washing with hot water (at least 180° F) and soap or detergent. The licensee must clean and sanitize the primary enclosures and ensure that all aspects of the enclosure are maintained in a clean and sanitized condition in order to support the health of the dogs.

Veterinary care for dogs.

The attending veterinarian did not complete the regularly scheduled site visit within 12 months of each visit. One was completed on May 25, 2024 and the next was completed on September 17, 2025. Regularly scheduled site visits are essential in determining if all aspects of animal care (nutrition, health, environment, water, and air quality, etc.) are being provided to the dogs. The licensee must have regularly scheduled visits, not less than once every 12 months, by the attending veterinarian to the facility where animals are kept, to assess and ensure the adequacy of veterinary care and other aspects of animal care and use.

3.13(a)(2)

Veterinary care for dogs.

The complete physical examinations from head to tail on approximately 78 adult dogs by the attending veterinarian was not completed within 12 months. One was completed in May 25, 2024 and then the next was performed September 17, 2025. Failure to have each dog examined at least once every 12 months may result in delay of treatment and diagnosis for disease, illness, or injury. Correct by ensuring that a complete physical examination from head to tail of each adult dog by the attending veterinarian is conducted not less than once every 12 months.

Veterinary care for dogs.

The facility is not following their preventative plan for properly trimmed nails. The plan states adult dog's nails will be trimmed once monthly, seven adult dogs were identified with long nails and the licensee stated it had likely been more than a month since they were last trimmed. Long nails may affect the gait of the animal and lead to possible injuries. The facility must follow their program of veterinary care's preventative care and treatment plans for healthy and unmatted hair coats, properly trimmed nails, and clean and healthy eyes, ears, skin, and teeth,

Veterinary care for dogs.

The facility is not recording the medication name and date of the sedation reversal medication given during procedures. Without proper documentation, it is difficult to determine if the animals received adequate veterinary care. Dealers must keep copies of medical records for dogs and make the records available for APHIS inspection. These records must include the names of all vaccines and treatments administered and the dates of administration.
