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### 3.13(a)(2)

#### Veterinary care for dogs.

The dogs are not receiving the required physical exam by the attending veterinarian every 12 months. Documentation showed that some of the dogs had received physical exams from the veterinarian in June 2021. The licensee stated that the next physical exam by the veterinarian occurred in October 2022 and only some of the dogs received a physical exam while others were just observed by the attending veterinarian. Failure to have each dog physically examined by the veterinarian every 12 months may allow medical conditions to go unnoticed which could have a negative impact on the health and well-being of the dogs.

Each dealer must follow an appropriate program of veterinary care that includes a complete physical examination from head to tail of each dog by the attending veterinarian not less than once every 12 months. The licensee must ensure that each dog is physically examined by the attending veterinarian at least once every 12 months in order to support their health and well-being.

To be corrected by: From this day forward the licensee must ensure each dog receives the physical examination once every 12 months.

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### **Veterinary care for dogs.**

The licensee has acquired a new Attending Veterinarian and a new Program of Veterinary Care. The Program of Veterinary Care is incomplete and the written schedule for treating intestinal parasites in adult dogs could not be located. The licensee stated that the adult dogs are dewormed twice a year. Failure to document the deworming schedule may interfere with the ability of APHIS officials to determine if the dogs are receiving adequate veterinary care.

Each dealer must follow an appropriate program of veterinary care for dogs that is documented in writing and addresses the requirements for adequate veterinary care and includes the sampling and treatment plan for parasites. The licensee must add the deworming schedule for adult dogs to the Program of Veterinary Care to ensure the animals are receiving adequate veterinary care.

### **3.13(b)(1)**

#### **Veterinary care for dogs.**

The licensee is using invoices from the attending veterinarian as medical records to document treatments and procedures the dogs have undergone. Many of these invoices do not contain the identification of the dog that received the treatment including an invoice that lists a dog which received a dental cleaning and extraction and a puppy which received a hernia repair. Official identification documented on medical records is necessary for APHIS officials to determine which dog the record belongs to and if the animal has received adequate veterinary care.

Each dealer shall keep copies of medical records that include the identity of the animal including identifying marks, tattoos, or tags and the animal's breed, sex and age. The licensee must ensure that all medical records contain the

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identification of the animal as well as all other required information.

### 3.13(b)(4)

#### **Veterinary care for dogs.**

The licensee had some of the dogs physically examined by the attending veterinarian in October 2022. No medical record could be provided documenting which dogs were examined and the results of the exams. Failure to document examinations and the results may interfere with the ability of APHIS officials to determine if the animals are receiving adequate veterinary care.

Each dealer shall keep copies of medical records that include the dates and findings/results of all screening, routine, or other required or recommended tests or examinations. The licensee must document on a medical record each time a dog is physically examined and the results of those exams. The licensee must ensure that all medical records are complete and contain all required information.
