ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

****A black and white, female Poodle (MC # OAO2310555) had a red bulbous growth protruding from its left eye, the growth was approximately the size of pea. The right eye had creamy white mucus on the upper eye lid and at the interior corner of the eye. Both eyes appear watery and moist. Eye problems can be painful, can progress rapidly, and can result in loss of vision. The licensee was verbally instructed to have this dog examined by a veterinarian by close of business June 26, 2014. The licensee must keep records of the diagnosis, treatment, and follow-up care and must make these records available to the inspector upon request.

2.40(b)(2) REPEAT

ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

****A female grey Chihuahua (MC # OA0231542) had a raised red crusty spot on the top of its head, along with multiple white hairless spots that are on the top of its head, neck and shoulders. The licensee stated the spots were noticed at approximately three weeks of age; the dog is now 3 months old. The licensee stated that a veterinarian had not been consulted concerning the hair loss. Hair loss can be the sign of an underlying health issue. The licensee must consult with attending veterinarian and document the outcome of this consultation and make it available to the inspector upon request

****There is an adult male Yorkshire Terrier (MC#OA02006835) and a red Poodle "Wendy" (3 months old) both have excessive matting of the fur with several larger sized matts noted along the dogs backs, bellies and rear legs. Excessive matting causes pain and discomfort to the animal. In addition, matting can foster skin infections and can hinder the animals ability to move or defecate normally. The licensee needs to remove the matted fur on these dogs. As part of the facility's program of veterinary care, the licensee must establish and follow a program of regular coat maintenance for all the dogs to prevent the development of excessive matting. The licensee must ensure that all animals receive adequate veterinary care at all times.

HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

DRAINAGE AND WASTE DISPOSAL

**** Along the back edge of three pens housing 11 dogs' excessive feces has collected at the enclosure fence line. This is the area that the licensee washes feces and animal waste out of the enclosures. The feces have accumulated to a depth of two to three inches, the licensee stated "it was a week ago that the drainage area was cleaned", the licensee is not removing and disposing of animal waste on a regular and frequent basis. Housing facilities must be equipped with disposal facilities and drainage systems that are constructed and operated so that animal waste and water are rapidly eliminated. Large amounts of collected feces, urine and wash water can attract rodents and pests, can harbor diseases, and can cause odor. The licensee must provide for regular and frequent collection, removal and disposal of animal waste that minimizes contamination and disease risks.
