TIME AND METHOD OF IDENTIFICATION.

Twelve Beagle puppies, less than 16 weeks old, currently at the licensee's facility did not have any form of identification. Appropriate identification of dogs is necessary to know the identity of the dogs with certainty and to meet recordkeeping requirements for inventory, disposition, transport, and healthcare documentation. The licensee must properly identify puppies with an acceptable form of identification, which include a microchip, tatoo, a collar and tag, or a plastic-type collar with the required information legibly written.

HEALTH CERTIFICATION AND IDENTIFICATION.

The licensee could not produce health certificates for twelve Beagle puppies currently in her facility, which were acquired from a breeder in Arkansas. Health certificates are necessary to document that a veterinarian has examined the puppies and verified that they appear to be free of any infectious disease or physical abnormality which would endanger the animal(s) or other animals or endanger public health. The licensee must ensure that all dogs she acquires are accompanied by a health certificate issued not more than 10 days prior to transportation.

3.6(c)(1)(i)

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

Twelve weaned puppies being held at the licensee's facility did not have adequate floor space. A Cocker Spaniel mix was 22 inches long (from nose to base of tail), required 784 square inches of space, but only had 576 square inches of floor space. Two yellow Labrador puppies, each measuring 17 inches long, required 1,058 square inches of space, but were house together in an enclosure that only provided 576 square inches of space. Two Beagle puppies measuring 16 inches long and a Beagle puppy measuring 19 inches long were housed together in an enclosure providing 576 square inches of space, but needed 1,593 square inches of floor space. Four beagles, three of which measured 15 inches long and one of which measured 16 inches long, required a total of 1,807 square inches of floor space, but were housed together in an enclosure that provided 600 square inches of floor space. Two Beagle puppies, each measuring 17 inches long, required 1,058 square inches but were housed

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together in an enclosure that provided only 600 square inches of floor space. Adequate floor space is necessary to allow proper movement, postural adjustment and exercise for the well-being of the dogs. The licensee must ensure that all dogs have adequate floor space.

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

Three puppies (two Labradors and one English Bulldog) currently at the licensee's facility did not have at least 6 inches of head space in their primary enclosures. Adequate head space is necessary to allow the dogs to make normal movements and postural adjustments. The licensee must ensure that all dogs have at least 6 inches of head space in their primary enclosures.
