PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

The feet and legs of at least one three week old puppy was observed falling through the openings of the welded wire flooring. Six other puppies can be injured if their feet fall through openings in the floor. In addition, the daily activity and mobility of the puppies is affected. All primary enclosures must have floors constructed in a manner that protects the puppy's feet and legs from injury and does not allow the puppies' feet or legs to pass through any openings. CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

* There is a mixture of dirt, grease and other excreta accumulating on at least three metal entryway doors. Four dogs are in contact with the affected surfaces located in shelter housing. The affected area covers approximately 25 to 50 percent of the metal entryway doors. Cleaning of surfaces is necessary to prevent an accumulation of excreta and other disease hazards. This indicates an unsanitary living condition exists that could lead to potential disease or health risks. Cleanliness is important to the health and well-being of the animals. When primary enclosures are not regularly cleaned and then sanitized, it doesn't ensure that the various types of germs (such as viruses, bacteria, parasites, etc.) have been killed. Proper cleaning and then sanitizing the primary enclosures can help to eliminate disease and health risks. The licensee must ensure that all surfaces which any dog comes in contact with must be sanitized at least once every two weeks to prevent an accumulation of dirt, debris, food waste, excreta and other disease hazards.
