ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

*Adult, female, soft coated wheaten terrier with chip number 103 512 083 has skin lesions that are red and moist on the tops of both ear flaps.

*Adult, female husky mix with chip number OAO1491678 has skin lesions at the tips of her ears. There is a large scab at the tip of the left ear with blood around the edges of the scab.

Ear lesions such as these are usually associated with fly bites but can also be seen with ear infections and trauma and are painful.

*Adult, male Yorkshire terrier with chip number OAO1572839 has a cloudy spot with a small amount of red irritation in the center of the surface of the right eye. The white of the eye is mildly red in color. There is no discharge from the eye. Eye problems can result from trauma, infection, and other medical problems and can be painful.

The animals listed above must be examined by a licensed veterinarian by close of business on 24 June 2015 in order to ensure that an accurate diagnosis is obtained and an appropriate treatment plan is developed and followed. This information, including the diagnosis, treatment and resolution of the condition, must be documented and made available to the inspector upon request.

HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

The sheltered building housing adult dogs has a buildup of feces and liquid waste in the wash down area on the north side where the drain leaves the structure. The feces are also building up on the ground directly below this area. There were large numbers of flies on the feces and a strong odor. Accumulation of waste leads to pests, odors and possible disease transmission. The licensee must ensure that housing facilities provide for regular and frequent collection, removal, and disposal of animal and food wastes, bedding, debris, garbage, water, other fluids and wastes, and dead animals, in a manner that minimizes contamination and disease risks. Housing facilities must be equipped with disposal facilities and drainage systems that are constructed and operated so that animal waste and water are rapidly eliminated and animals stay dry. Disposal and drainage systems must minimize vermin and pest infestation, insects, odors, and disease hazards. All drains must be properly constructed, installed, and

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maintained. To be corrected by 29 June 2015.
