2.40(b)(2) REPEAT

ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

Female, gray and white Shih Tzu mix "Sassy" with number 204 has a buildup of brown material completely coating the upper "cheek teeth" (premolars and molars) on both sides. The first and second "cheek teeth" (premolars) on the upper right side are loose. The gum line over these teeth has recessed, exposing the roots of the teeth. There is also some gum recession on the upper right canine tooth. Dental disease can cause damage to the gum tissue and tooth and mouth structures, be painful, and impact the ability of the dog to eat normally, affecting the overall health of the animal. The licensee must have this animal examined by a licensed veterinarian by 15 March 2014 in order to ensure that an accurate diagnosis is obtained and that an appropriate treatment plan is developed and followed. The licensee must document the outcome of this consultation and make it available to the inspector upon request.

There is a bottle of Pyrantal Pamoate with an expiration date of 05/09. This is the medication that the licensee has on the premises to deworm the dogs as directed on the program of veterinary care. Expired medications can experience spoilage or have reduced efficacy. This could lead to prolonged illness or suffering for the animals needing the drug. The licensee must ensure that all medications used in the facility are not expired and labeled properly in accordance with standard veterinary practices.

3.1(c)(1) REPEAT

HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

- *The wood on the main enclosure dividing wall (running north and south) between the two sheltered housing buildings is splintered, deteriorating, dry and untreated.
- *At least three enclosures (two of which house litters of puppies) in the indoor portions of sheltered enclosures have newspapers and blankets that are soiled and covered with leaves.
- *Surfaces that are not able to be readily cleaned and sanitized can play a role in disease transmission. The licensee must maintain all housing surfaces so that they are able to be readily cleaned and sanitized or are removed or replaced when worn or soiled.

The dogs cited for veterinary care non-compliant items on the inspection dated 5 Sept 2013 were assessed by the attending veterinarian.
