Records: Dealers and exhibitors.

At the time of inspection, the licensee did not have complete records of acquisition for the current inventory of animals on the property. For example, three Asian Otters did not have a record of acquisition available for review. Acquisition and disposition records are required so that animals being used in regulated activities can be accurately tracked to ensure their legal acquisition, proper care, and humane transportation. Licensees shall maintain accurate and up-to-date acquisition and disposition records for any animal acquired, owned, held, or otherwise in his or her possession or under his or her control, or which is transported, euthanized, sold or otherwise disposed of by the licensee.

3.75(e)

Housing facilities, general.

Within the feed storage room, there was one open bag of monkey biscuits that was not stored in a leak proof container with a tightly fitting lid. Open food bags that are left outside of a container are susceptible to contamination by pests and deterioration to the elements (i.e. humidity, heat, moisture). Open food bags must be kept in leakproof containers with tightly fitting lids to prevent spoilage and contamination.

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An igloo shelter within an enclosure housing one male rhesus macaque contained an excessive amount of feces build up. Excess build-up of feces may attract pests and poses a disease hazard for the animal contained therein. Primary enclosures must be spot-cleaned with sufficient frequency to ensure all animals the freedom to avoid contact with excreta, or as often as necessary to reduce disease hazards, insects, pests, and odors.

3.125(a)

Facilities, general.

An enclosure housing two raccoons had a 4x4 wooden beam that had deteriorated to approximately 50% of its mass at the bottom portion. The raccoons were also digging a hole around the affected portion of the beam. The jagged edges of the wood pose an injury hazard to the animals contained therein; furthermore, the dirt hole poses a possible access point into the adjoining enclosure allowing for unauthorized access between the animals contained and the neighboring animals.

Additionally, a male camel was being housed in an area that contained fence equipment, an assortment of motorized vehicles and other construction equipment. Access to these areas and items pose a risk of injury to the camel contained therein. The indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to contain the animals.

This is a 1st Relicense Inspection for a Class "B" license. The inspection and exit briefing were conducted with the Applicant. All items must be in compliance within 2 more inspection(s) or by December 12th, 2021 or the applicant will forfeit the license fee and must wait 6 months to reapply. Please contact your inspector to schedule your next Relicense Inspection. Regulated activity can continue under your existing USDA license until it expires.
