ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

An adult male sable domestic ferret had reddish brown dry scabs and patchy hair loss over the right shoulder blade and neck. The first area was approximately 0.5 inch by 0.5 inch in size and was located over the right shoulder blade. The second area was approximately 0.5 inch by 0.5 inch and was located over the back of the neck. Facility owner indicated that this animal had been acquired approximately 4-5 days earlier as part of a pair, and that both ferrets were placed in the enclosure with another adult ferret. Facility owner indicated that no scabs or hair loss had been noted on this animal.

Daily observation of all animals is important to ensure that conditions that can negatively affect health and well-being are recognized in a timely manner. Additionally, when observed, problems relating to animal health or behavior should be communicated to the attending veterinarian so that appropriate methods can be used to ensure adequate care. Injuries or diseases that not treated properly may be painful and can lead to infection or other veterinary care health problems. The facility must use appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries.

At the time of inspection, the animal was placed in a separate enclosure and the facility owner agreed to contact the attending veterinarian promptly.

Correct by contacting a veterinarian for assessment and treatment as appropriate. Correct by Monday, January 20th, 2020.

ENVIRONMENT ENHANCEMENT TO PROMOTE PSYCHOLOGICAL WELL-BEING.

An environmental enrichment plan was not documented for the nonhuman primates at the facility (1 ring tailed lemur and 1 Capuchin monkey).

Nonhuman primates have many complex social and environmental needs. Failure to provide opportunities for social and environmental activities may result in boredom, stress, inactivity, weight gain, and may contribute to the

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development of abnormal or harmful behaviors.

Correct by documenting an enrichment plan for nonhuman primates at the facility. The enrichment plan must address at minimum social and environmental enrichment for the nonhuman primates, and must be approved by the attending veterinarian. Correct by March 1, 2020.
