#### Health certification and identification.

The licensee purchased two red handed tamarins on June 5, 2022 and transported them from Florida to Louisiana without a valid health certificate. Health certificates are required before transporting nonhuman primates across state lines to ensure that the animals are evaluated by a licensed veterinarian and are free of any infectious disease or physical abnormality which would endanger the nonhuman primate, other animals or endanger public health. Dealers must not transport any non human primates in commerce unless accompanied by a health certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian no more than 10 days prior to the transport.

#### Environment enhancement to promote psychological well-being.

At the time of inspection, the licensee possessed a singly housed infant red handed tamarin, 8 weeks old. The licensee acquired the animal on June 5, 2022. The licensee did not have a documented Environment Enhancement Program for nonhuman primates available for review. Dealers must develop, document and provide a plan that includes specific provisions which address the social needs, environmental enrichment, and psychological well being of the species
