Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

At the time of inspection, there was no written program of veterinary care available for review.

A completed written program of veterinary care is important for the care of the animals and ensures clear and accurate communication between the facility and the attending vet.

Each exhibitor shall employ an attending veterinarian under formal arrangements. In the case of a part-time attending veterinarian or consultant arrangements, the formal arrangements shall include a written program of veterinary care and regularly scheduled visits to the premises of the exhibitor.

2.75(b)(1)

Records: Dealers and exhibitors.

During the review of records, the licensee was unable to provide complete acquisition and disposition records for birds. Cage cards are used to document births; however, these records are discarded after rearing and are not maintained. The facility tracks the number of birds sold but does not maintain records of birds that died or were euthanized.

Failure to maintain complete acquisition and disposition records interferes with the ability to accurately identify animals and trace their movement.

The licensee shall make, keep, and maintain records that fully and correctly disclose information concerning regulated animals purchased, born, hatched or otherwise acquired, as well as animals transported, sold, euthanized, or otherwise disposed.

Inspection Report

During the inspection, 6 budgies were observed outside their enclosures and flying free inside the Big Barn.

Enclosures that fail to safely contain birds may result in escape, injury, or death of the animal. Birds that are outside of their enclosure are at increased risk of predation, possible restricted access to food, water, shelter, and potential non-recovery.

Primary enclosures must be constructed and maintained so that they contain the birds securely.

3.158(a)(1) Repeat
Cleaning, sanitization, housekeeping, and pest control.

The facility failed to prevent the accumulation excreta and food waste from the primary enclosures housing birds. In one enclosure containing a pair of breeding budgies the droppings were piled up the level of the perch (approximately 4 inches). In another enclosure there was a mound of fecal approximately 2 inches in diameter that was covered in a green hairy mold-like substance. Approximately 70 percent of the enclosures in Willow barn and the Big Barn were covered with a layer of caked-on excreta and food waste. There were approximately 10 cages with dead budgies in various states of decay

Failure to clean accumulations of waste materials can increase disease hazards, attract insects, pests, and be a source of odors.

Excreta and food waste must be removed from the primary enclosures and from under and from around primary enclosures as often as necessary to prevent excessive accumulation of feces and food waste, to reduce disease hazards, insects, pests, and odors.
