Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

The licensee is not observing all animals daily to assess their health and well-being. During the inspection, the inspector identified a deceased sugar glider in one of the cages housing two other animals. The animal was dried up and decomposed, indicating it had been deceased for at least several days. When asked about frequency of observation, the licensee stated that, although an employee feeds and waters the animals daily, the animals are only observed approximately every three weeks.

Not observing animals on a daily basis can delay identification of illness or injury, which may lead to worsening health issues.

Each dealer must establish and maintain a program of adequate veterinary care that includes daily observation of all animals to assess their health and well-being.

Contingency planning.

During the record review, the inspector noted that the contingency plan was last reviewed on 8/18/2024, and the licensee acknowledged that he had not completed the required annual review. Failure to review contingency plans on an annual basis can negatively affect the health and well-being of the animals by leading to delayed or ineffective responses to hazards, delays in obtaining veterinary care, and disruptions in routine animal care. The plan must be reviewed by the dealer at least annually to ensure it adequately addresses the criteria listed in paragraph (a) of this section. Each licensee must maintain documentation of their annual reviews, including any amendments or changes made since the previous year's review.

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Inspection Report

Sanitation.

On entering the hedgehog room—which contained striped weasels, hedgehogs, giant flying squirrels, feeder mice (not regulated), African pygmy dormice, and three banded armadillos—the inspectors immediately noticed a strong ammonia odor. The odor caused noticeable irritation to the nose and eyes and persisted throughout the inspection. The facility representative asked the inspectors if the odor was also affecting them. Several enclosures housing striped weasels also contained an excessive buildup of feces. The licensee stated that these enclosures were cleaned weekly.

Failure to clean primary enclosures as often as necessary allows excreta and odors to accumulate, which can negatively impact the animals by increasing disease risks, decreasing air quality, contaminating food and water sources, and causing physical discomfort.

The dealer must remove excreta from primary enclosures frequently enough to prevent contamination, minimize disease hazards, and control odors.

Sanitation.

The kitchen—where staff prepare diets for the animals in the collection—contained excessive rodent droppings along the floor perimeters, on carts and items stored on the carts, on food bags and dishes. Failure to maintain an effective pest control program exposes animals to disease risks, decreases air quality, contaminates their environment, and increases the likelihood of injuries. A safe and effective program for the control of insects, ectoparasites, and avian and mammalian pests shall be established and maintained.
