ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

An 18 year old camel, Pretty Girl, would not rise from a kneeling position. She was also lifting her right forelimb off the ground as if it were painful. She became agitated and moved away on her knees when the employee and then the licensee attempted to encourage her to rise.

The licensee stated he had her on glucosamine, but not anti-inflammatories because he was told by some exotic animal veterinarians and "Kentucky vets" (equine) that those medications were not useful. There are no written instructions for the equine-formulated glucosamine product.

The Attending Veterinarian (AV) must be involved with plans for addressing chronic animal health conditions in order to reduce animal discomfort and avoid suffering. Any medications or supplements given her that are not labeled for use in camels must be used only with written instructions from the AV.

Correct by consulting with the AV as soon as possible and developing and implementing a treatment plan by close of business on Friday, April 6, 2018.

This inspection and exit interview were conducted with the licensee.

The inspection was also accompanied by a USDA APHIS VS VMO.
